What goes on in an internship?

The second major area of the internship has been the practical experience I've received as part of a large, healthy ministry. I've participated in weekly staff meetings, discipled students individually, co-led the student officer team, and generally seen what goes into making a ministry function. A third area of learning has been the seven full-time staff who have well over 70 years of combined ministry experience. I've met with several of them on a weekly basis to be mentored, and the rest as I had questions about their areas of expertise. I've also learned much just from their examples and seeing how they handle situations. The final area has been the personal growth and ministry I've received.

I've come to realize just how many broken places were still in my life that I had forgotten about, thought were healed, or had never recognized. Some have been character issues and some more deeply personal such as the shame, embarrassment, and inadequacy I've felt because of my stuttering. But God has begun a deep process of healing and restoration that I cannot fully explain. This has probably been one of the most broken, yet healing, seasons of my entire life. 😊
